### Doncaster bring home their first cup in 25 years

Doncaster's Premier League Women have not held a premiership cup aloft for 25 years. That all changed on Sunday when the Dons held their season's undefeated record intact and claimed a 3-1 victory over Greensborough. The score looks like a comfortable win. Nothing could be further from the truth. Greensborough won premierships in 2011, 12 and 13, Burra knew what was required to win flags and applied that pressure all day.

The opening three minutes were typical of a final with neither side being able to control general play. But at the three-minute mark Doncaster's Georgia Pascoe intercepted a Greensborough pass and handed off to Madi Ratcliffe who pushed into the scoring circle and her shot at goal found the narrowest of gaps to put the Dons on the board.

The early goal meant very little to Greensborough who simply settled into their system and peppered their circle. Three short corners at the six, seven and ten minute marks reflected their pressure but Doncaster's battery led by Meg Pearce kept the net clean.

A classic finals arm wrestle followed with both sides holding the ball and building pressure, but defences were holding sway. Doncaster were looking more threatening when pushing forward but deep penetration was scarce. Fast breaks to both sides within two minutes of half time brought the crowd to their feet but both shots were just wide of the net and Doncaster would take the single first half goal to the break.

With the temperature in the mid 20's the break was most welcome and Greensborough came back fresher. The Burra knew a goal had to be recovered and they were single minded, controlling general play and building pressure. A short corner at the three-minute mark was once again kept at bay by Pearce's charge. But the Greensborough pressure did take its toll and a Doncaster pass fell to the Greensborough striker who pushed into the circle and scored.

Greensborough had now levelled the score and held the momentum. Memories of recent grand final victories would have been flooding back. However, Doncaster have played 2015 with greater composure and the experienced Sam Snow and Maria Romagosa steadied the ship from the back half and the Dons put the brakes on the Burra's surge. Pearce, Liz Flack and Hayley Padget started to shine through the midfield and slowly the momentum swung back.

Greensborough's pressure was consistent and while the Dons built pressure, passes were off the mark. The arm wrestle continued.

With just 11 minutes left to play Flack and Nic Hogan combined to push the ball deep into attack. Hogan found Ratcliffe who passed to Izzy Peskett and she pushed into the circle. A Greensborough foot led to just Doncaster's third short corner for the match. While the first short corner was defended another Burra foot led to a second. On this occasion a powerful Romagosa shot hit the backboard at speed. Doncaster's composure and consistent pressure was rewarded.

And the Dons weren't finished, they continued to hold possession and pepper the circle, the Burra continued to fight tooth and nail.

With seven minutes on the clock, Romagosa intercepted a Burra pass outside the 25-metre line and took on three defenders pushing into the circle. A Burra obstruction led to a Doncaster short corner. Ratcliffe dummied a shot and handed off to Snow and her powerful drag flick found the net. 3-1 with the clock ticking and the organisers might have been putting green and gold ribbon on the cup.
